UNCOMPROMISING FAITH

Noah's journey with HSM (High School Ministry) began on March 26, 2023, but the seeds were sown years ago when he was initially invited by his friend, Trenton, to Choctober fest at JHM (Junior High Ministry). At the time, it was just a fun event for Noah, and he didn't give it much thought.

However, life had a way of bringing Noah back to the church. Feeling like something was missing, he reached out to Trenton about church. That is when Noah started going to HSM with Trenton.

From the very start, Noah felt a sense of belonging at HSM. But, Summer Camp 2023, is really what became a pivotal moment in Noah's spiritual journey. At first Noah wasn't sure he would be able to attend due to finances, but he was awarded a scholarship and registered for camp just a week before the deadline. It turned out to be a life-changing decision.

During camp, Noah not only accepted God but also felt his presence for the first time in his life. Doubts that had plagued him were replaced by a newfound connection to God. And Noah's decision to follow Jesus at camp led to his baptism.

Noah's story serves as a reminder that there is always hope, and with the support of a caring community, lives can be transformed.



UNPRECEDENTED HOPE

Shannon's recent mission trip to Turkana, Kenya, showcased the profound impact Global Compassion trips can have on the lives of others. That impact is exemplified by two heartwarming encounters with Paul and William.

While on the trip, Shannon encountered a young boy named Paul who was lying motionless on the ground outside the restroom. With the help of nearby students and teachers, he was rushed to medical care and was hospitalized with malaria. Miraculously, within two days, Paul was back at school. Shannon even took things a step further and began a monthly sponsorship through our partner, Missions of Hope International (MOHI), so that Paul could have access to school and care for his basic needs.

Then, there was William, a baby Shannon met alongside his mother. Upon holding the seemingly newborn baby, Shannon was stunned to learn he was actually 14 months old. Weighing only 12 pounds and measuring 14 inches, his malnourished condition was dire. Shannon was able to secure a spot for William in a nutritional program through MOHI where he showed significant improvement.

These stories are just a glimpse at the impact of global mission trips. Paul's life was saved, and William received a second chance, largely thanks to the efforts of Shannon and the team she served alongside. In communities like these, where neglect and despair often prevail, unprecedented hope offered by a compassion team can become a catalyst for change. It shines a spotlight on their needs, infusing them with resources, energy, and most importantly, a sense of value.

Shannon's journey to Kenya illuminates the boundless power of compassion and the immeasurable value of global missions in transforming lives and communities.
